Threshold of 25 or more requests is needed to hold a hearing on a Dual Notice or a Notice of Intent to Adopt Rule Without a Hearing

The standard Administrative Procedures Act (APA) rulemaking process used by the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) normally provides at least three opportunities for public involvement:

- 1. When the Request for Comments (RFC) is published in the *State Register*, it communicates general ideas for the rulemaking. This is an opportunity for stakeholders to provide formal comments and input on the rulemaking ideas that may narrow or broaden the scope of the project. Stakeholder data or other relevant information can be submitted at this time. An example of information submitted could be relevant cost information for implementing the general ideas announced in the RFC. The MPCA encourages stakeholder participation at this early stage of the process so that the MPCA can consider relevant information as it determines the shape and scope of its proposed rulemaking.
- 2. During this phase of the rulemaking, the MPCA generally makes a preliminary draft of rule language available and invites informal public comments and specifies conditions and deadlines.
- 3. When the MPCA publishes a Notice of Intent to Adopt Rules, it signals a final opportunity for formal stakeholder input (if no public hearing is held). The Notice will indicate all relevant submittal conditions. At this stage, the MPCA would provide a Statement of Need and Reasonableness (SONAR) and proposed Rules for formal public review/comment.
- 4. The APA may or not require the MPCA to hold a public hearing based on hearing requests or conditional needs. If held, the public hearing provides an additional formal opportunity for stakeholders to testify or submit written testimony in front of an Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) who presides over the hearing. Check with the MPCA contact person to inspect written comments, written requests for a public hearing, and names of parties who requested a public hearing.

On completion of APA notice requirements, the MPCA will publish final adoption of Rules. Unless otherwise specified, most Rules normally become effective five working days after they appear in the *State Register*. Notice, <u>exempt</u> rulemaking follows a more abbreviated process.
