


Overall program goals







Where are we now?


- Over 210 local SSTS programs (per 2012 Annual SSTS Report)
 - · 86 counties
 - 72 cities
 - 50 townships
 - 2 other permitting authorities
- Over 546,000 SSTS
 - 37.4 billion gallons sewage per year
- From 2002 to 2012 (per Annual Reports
 - 69,890 new SSTS
 - 67,600 replacement SSTS









- Department of Health Well Program
- Department of Natural Resources Shoreland Areas
- Department of Transportation Load limits, highway safety
- Department of Agriculture AgBMP low-interest loans
- Housing Finance Agency Low-interest loans to low-income SSTS owners

Summary

- SSTS program goals to build effective systems, to properly maintain them for long term use, and to eliminate imminent public heath threats.
- There are over 546,000 SSTS state-wide regulated by at least 210 local SSTS programs.
- MPCA role defined in laws and rules; local program roles defined in rules.
- Six other state agencies impact SSTS, including topics such as plumbing, wells, shoreland areas, and financial assistance.
